


To have missed crown would be, and should be, a wound bound with salt! I am honored to have lent my service and to have been present with my lady.


The Return of the Marinus Cook's Guild

The meeting began promptly at 1:15pm and continued to just after 3 o'clock.

During these two hours, Clement discussed many of the various qualities of kitchen cutlery, their purpose, care, and proper function. He was also quite adept and able to demonstrate such use and care, to include the differences of sharpening versus honing a blade, the differences between Eastern versus Western blades, as well as artistic sculpting, cutting, and chopping techniques.

Turn right onto Martin Luther King Jr Dr. Pass CITGO in 1.0 mi 1.9 mi

Keep right onto S Davie St 269 ft

Turn right to stay on S Davie St 0.2 mi

Turn left onto E Washington St, and then immediately turn right onto S Elm St 0.1 mi

Arrive at The Elm Street Center. The last intersection is W Washington St. If you reach E February One Pl, you've gone too far. Parking is on the next street over behind the Center in the parking garage at no cost or on the street.

Beware the meters. The only entrance to the site will be through the parking garage. Gate will located at that entrance. There will be no street access from the front of the building.
